### Works In Progress

"Privacy Puzzles: From Privacy to Data Governance" (working title)

This work in progress uses two recent privacy cases to consider the conceptual confusions of contemporary privacy and argues that some of these confusions (or puzzles) may be resolved by recognizing a class of non-privacy personal interests in information. Classifying these interests as fellow travelers with, but distinct from, privacy has both conceptual and practical benefits for the law governing information about people. First, it resolves problems of using the same conceptual vocabulary to mark so-called privacy interests of different kinds, that are often in direct tension with one another. Practically, it can clarify the political and legal aims of doctrinal trends that use privacy arguments to legitimate and encase commercial surveillance from public oversight and regulation.

## “Big Mother” (working title)

This work in progress uses the fertility, prenatal, and neonatal digital tracking industry to explore the relationship between biological and social reproduction and commercial datafication. Fertility data has received a notable uptick in legal attention following *Dobbs*. Early commentators are particularly focused on the privacy risk this data poses in a post-*Roe* world, and the capacity of law enforcement in states without abortion protection to access users’ fertility data. But the datafication of fertility is significant in deeper ways. Fertility datafication collapses into one data relation an economic relation of production (creating data of economic value to be exploited by companies for money) and a social relation of reproduction (datafying the reproductive capacities of people and rendering legible the relationship people have with the idea of a child). It provides a compelling place—the beginning, in one sense—to understand the long and deep entanglement between extracting value from people and gendering the care of people; and how this entanglement meets the datafication of social life.
