


Hilary M. Allen JD Class of 2022

Hilary Allen is originally from Chicago but has lived in a few states and in Germany. She currently resides in Dearborn, Michigan. She earned her Bachelor of Arts in Peace and Justice Studies from Wellesley College.

At Michigan Law, Hilary worked as a studentattorney for the Pediatric Advocacy Clinic and the Community Enterprise Clinic. She also served as co-president of Reproductive Rights and Justice, now known as If/When/ How: Lawyering for Reproductive Justice. In addition, she served as chair of the committee for the 43rd Butch Carpenter Scholarship Gala and as 3L representative for the Black Law Students Association.

Hilary spent her 1L summer as a law clerk at the Michigan Poverty Law Program. She spent her 2L summer at Honigman LLP, and she will join their Detroit office after graduation.



Roger Gregory, '78 Chief Judge, U.S. Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit

The Hon. Roger Gregory, '78, is the first African American to sit on the United States Court of Appeals for the Fourth Circuit. He was nominated by President Clinton and renominated by President Bush,

making him the only person to be appointed to the United States Court of Appeals by two presidents of different political parties.

Judge Gregory began his legal career at Butzel, Long, Gust, Klein & Van Zile in Detroit. In 1982, he formed the law firm Wilder & Gregory with L. Douglas Wilder. Upon Wilder's election as governor of Virginia, Judge Gregory became managing partner and served in that capacity, in addition to leading the firm's litigation section, until his appointment to the bench.

He served on the *Brown v. Board of Education* 50th Anniversary Commission, established by Congress to commemorate that landmark decision. By appointment of the Chief Justice of the United States, he served as chairman of the Judicial Conference Committee on the Administration of the United States Courts from 2006 to 2009. He also served on the American Bar Association's Commission on the American Jury and its Standing Committee on Public Education. His numerous awards and accolades include being named a Fellow of the Virginia State Bar Foundation and a member of the American Law Institute, as well as receiving the National Bar Association's Gertrude E. Rush and Equal Justice awards.

In addition to earning his JD at Michigan, Judge Gregory graduated from Virginia State University with a Bachelor of Arts, *summa cum laude*. He holds honorary degrees from several institutions.



Profile of the Class of 2022





ONE OF THE MOST COLORFUL FEATURES of an academic procession is the appearance of the graduates and faculty in full academic attire. These caps, gowns, and hoods have long histories, and their patterns and colors have special significance.

The origins of academic dress date back to the 12th and 13th centuries, when universities were taking form. The ordinary dress of the scholar—student or teacher was the dress of a cleric.


In modern universities, the distinctive mark of a degree is the hood, which in its earliest form was simply an article of clothing; since churches and lecture halls of European universities were cold and drafty, scholars wore their hoods as head coverings. American institutions, unlike those of England and Europe, have adopted a standard code of academic costume. The design of the gown, the color of the tassel on the cap, and the pattern, length, and colors of the hood all have special significance.

Both the associate and bachelor's gowns are closed at the throat and have long, pointed sleeves. The master's gown has oblong sleeves, open at the wrist, tapering at the back in a square cut, which ends in an arc cutaway. The doctor's gown is faced with velvet and has bell-shaped sleeves. Each sleeve carries three bars of velvet or chevrons.

The most colorful part of the costumes is the hood. The color of the velvet trim indicates the department that granted the degree, and the width of the trim corresponds to the level of degree (two, three, and four inches, respectively). The lining, or area inside the velvet, denotes the college or university awarding the degree. Michigan Law juris doctor candidates have purple velvet trim and maize and blue lining.

During the juris doctor degree recognition, recipients receive their hoods from faculty marshals as they enter the stage. After being draped with the hood, they walk across the stage for individual recognition.




