Alanna Autler JD Class of 2023

Law school was never the plan for Alanna Autler.

For nearly a decade after she earned her undergraduate degree from Northwestern University, where she majored in journalism, she worked as a television reporter in West Virginia, Tennessee, and Texas. But Autler's desire to better serve marginalized communities convinced her to pursue a law degree.

At Michigan Law, Autler worked as a student attorney for the Workers' Rights Clinic (now the 1L Advocacy Clinic) and the Child Advocacy Law Clinic. She also volunteered with the Eviction Defense Team and helped launch the Oral History Project for the Civil Rights Litigation Clearinghouse.

In June 2021, Autler gave birth to her daughter. The experience of attending law school while pregnant—then while caring for a newborn invigorated Autler to advocate for parents and other law students with nontraditional backgrounds. She served on the executive board of Older Wiser Law Students for three years, although she maintains she is definitely not wiser than anyone.

While Autler was born and raised in New Jersey, she now considers Michigan her home. She is a proud resident of Ypsilanti, where she lives with her husband and daughter. After graduation, she will join Neighborhood Defender Service in Detroit as a public defender.



Bridget Mary McCormack President and CEO of the American Arbitration Association-International Centre for Dispute Resolution

Bridget Mary McCormack is president and CEO of the American Arbitration Association-International Centre for Dispute Resolution. She is also a strategic advisor to the Future of the Profession Initiative at the University of Pennsylvania Carey Law School.

Until the end of 2022, McCormack was chief justice of the Michigan Supreme Court, a position her peers selected her for in January 2019 after she served for six years as a justice. While on the Court, she championed innovation and the use of technology to improve access to justice.

A graduate of New York University Law School, McCormack started her legal career in New York City. In 1996, she joined the Yale Law School faculty. She then joined the University of Michigan Law School faculty in 1998, where she taught criminal law, legal ethics, and numerous clinics. She was associate dean for clinical affairs from 2002 until 2012.

McCormack was elected to The American Law Institute in 2013. The attorney general of the United States appointed her to the National Commission on Forensic Science in 2014. In 2019, the governor of Michigan named her cochair of the Michigan Joint Task Force on Jail and Pretrial Incarceration. In 2020, she joined the American Bar Association's Council on Legal Education and Admission to the Bar and currently serves as vice chair. In 2021, the governor of Michigan asked her to co-chair the Michigan Task Force on Forensic Science and to chair the Michigan Jail Reform Advisory Council. She also chaired the Michigan Judicial Council, the strategic planning body for the judicial branch. In 2021, McCormack was also appointed to serve nationally on The Council of State Governments Healthy States National Task Force and the ABA Center for Innovation's Governing Council. She was also named chair of the ABA Board of Elections.

McCormack is an editor of the ABA's preeminent publication, *Litigation Journal*. She speaks and writes frequently about access to justice, innovation in the legal profession, and legal education. McCormack is married to Steven Croley, general counsel and chief policy officer at Ford Motor Company. They have four adult children.



Profile of the Class of 2023





ONE OF THE MOST COLORFUL FEATURES of an academic procession is the appearance of the graduates and faculty in full academic attire. These caps, gowns, and hoods have long histories, and their patterns and colors have special significance.

The origins of academic dress date back to the 12th and 13th centuries, when universities were taking form. The ordinary dress of the scholar—student or teacher was the dress of a cleric.


In modern universities, the distinctive mark of a degree is the hood, which in its earliest form was simply an article of clothing; since churches and lecture halls of European universities were cold and drafty, scholars wore their hoods as head coverings. American institutions, unlike those of England and Europe, have adopted a standard code of academic costume. The design of the gown; the color of the tassel on the cap; and the pattern, length, and colors of the hood all have special significance.

Both the associate and bachelor's gowns are closed at the throat and have long, pointed sleeves. The master's gown has oblong sleeves, open at the wrist, tapering at the back in a square cut, which ends in an arc cutaway. The doctor's gown is faced with velvet and has bell-shaped sleeves. Each sleeve carries three bars of velvet or chevrons.

The most colorful part of the costumes is the hood. The color of the velvet trim indicates the department that granted the degree, and the width of the trim corresponds to the level of degree (two, three, and four inches, respectively). The lining, or area inside the velvet, denotes the college or university awarding the degree. Michigan Law juris doctor candidates have purple velvet trim and maize and blue lining.

During the juris doctor degree recognition, recipients receive their hoods from faculty marshals as they enter the stage. After being draped with the hood, they walk across the stage for individual recognition.




