The Civil Rights Litigation Initiative ("the Initiative") provides law students at the University of Michigan Law School with the opportunity to litigate civil rights cases under the supervision of experienced faculty. The Initiative only accepts cases in the following areas: racial justice, police misconduct, fair housing, student rights, immigrant rights, free speech, women's rights, LGBT rights, ethnic and religious discrimination, voting rights, disability rights and the right to privacy. We also only accept cases that arose in Michigan.

If you would like the Initiative to consider your case, please fill out this form and email it to law-civilrights@umich.edu. We will determine whether an in-person meeting is appropriate. Please note that the Initiative takes only a few cases each semester. You should not count on the Initiative representing you unless and until the case is accepted and a retainer agreement is signed.
